# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### How long does it take to raise and train an assistance dog?

Puppies are cared for and trained by a puppy raiser for approximately 12 months. This is followed by 12 months of advanced obedience, task and public access training.

### How much does an assistance dog cost to train?

The average trained assistance dog is valued at approximately \$20,000.

### How much does an assistance dog cost a recipient?

Through the generosity of public donations assistance dogs are provided to the recipient free of charge.

### Who is eligible for an assistance dog?

Generally, an adult with a physical disability who is able to effectively communicate with, competently instruct, independently exercise and take part in caring for a dog is eligible.

### What tasks can an assistance dog do?

Trained dogs are able to perform many tasks including: opening and closing cupboards, doors and refrigerators, picking up dropped items, retrieving items from tables, cupboards, drawers and people, loading and unloading frontloading washing machines, carrying baskets, removing clothing, pulling a basket on wheels, taking a cordless phone to its owner, opening and closing wheelchair footplates, adjusting blankets and doonas, seeking help for their recipient.
